MetFilm School UK International Students Guide



London Campus

Our London campus is based at the famous Ealing Studios, known for productions including *The Ladykillers*, *Notting Hill*, *Downton Abbey*, and *The Theory of Everything*. Ealing is a vibrant borough situated in West London, and is home to a vast number of shops, bars, pubs, and restaurants, with something to suit every taste and budget.

Studying in London means that you have access to a huge range of filmmaking resources. London houses the British Film Institute, The Cinema Museum, The Kubrick Archives, and The London Film Museum. London is also a great place to find work in the industry; with the UK's largest film studios based either within or in easy reach of London. These include: Pinewood, Ealing, Shepperton, and 3 Mills Studios.



Leeds Campus

Like our London and Berlin campuses, MetFilm School Leeds is situated in a working film studio complex – Prime Studios, which plays host to professional film and television productions on an ongoing basis, and is next door to ITV Studios, the home of its flagship soap *Emmerdale Farm*, one of whose current directors is MetFilm School tutor Emma Lindley.

Yorkshire is a fast growing site for the screen industry – Channel 4 recently moved its headquarters to Leeds, joining ITV and BBC in having a permanent presence in the region, and a host of production companies have also made similar moves. When the industry grows, it needs space as well as talent, and the county is proud to boast several new studio developments.

Application Process

Undergraduate (BA) Degrees

Please note: MetFilm School Leeds undergraduate courses are offered through our partnership with the University of West London, and do not currently accept international students. For BA applications to MetFilm School London, please see the below information.

Entry Requirements

All applicants need to be 18 years or older at the time the programme begins. If you are over the age of 21, you are considered a mature student, so your application relies on relevant skills and experience rather than academic qualifications.

All applicants will be interviewed, either in person or online, with a member of our Admissions Team. This will allow us to understand your reasons for applying for a place, and your suitability.

Language Requirements

Students may need to provide evidence of their English language ability. The following tests are satisfactory to demonstrate this: IELTS, TOEFL, ESOL SELT B2 (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) Level 2, PTE Academic UKVI.

Students need to achieve an IELTS overall score of 6.5 (or equivalent), with at least 6.5 in writing, and 5.5 in listening, reading, and speaking.

Please note: For BA Screen Acting, students require an IELTS overall score of 6.0 (or equivalent), and a 5.5 in writing, listening, reading, and speaking.

Depending on their home country and previous education, students may not need to prove their knowledge of English. Find more information on our website.

Postgraduate (MA) Degrees

Standard Entry Requirements

All applicants must be 18 years or older at the time that the programme begins. Applicants require a 2:1 honours degree from a UK university or overseas equivalent.

Applicants for all MA Degrees *excluding MA Film & Television Production* must also submit a personal statement of at least 500 words.

Non-Standard Entry Requirements

Students with a degree below a 2:1 equivalent, or students without a degree, but who can demonstrate relevant industry experience, are still able to apply.

They will need to submit additional material with their application. Find more information on the Study with Us section of our website.

No degree or relevant work experience: Candidates with no degree or filmmaking experience do not meet the entry criteria.

Language Requirements

Students may need to provide evidence that their English language ability is at a B2 Level. The following tests are satisfactory to demonstrate this: IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge PET, ESOL Skills for Life Level 1 and 2, Trinity Level 1.

Students need to achieve an IELTS overall score of 6.5 (or equivalent), with at least 6.5 in writing, and 5.5 in listening, reading, and speaking.

Depending on their home country and previous education, students may not need to prove their knowledge of English. Find more information on our website.

Before you Arrive

On receiving an offer of a place on a MetFilm School accredited course, non-UK nationals will need to demonstrate either:

- Have settled or pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS) if an EU, EEA, or Swiss national that has been resident in the UK prior to 31st December 2020;

OR

- Meet the criteria for a Student VISA

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure they comply with the relevant immigration rules for their circumstances. MetFilm School conducts immigration checks on all students during registration events. Students that cannot prove their immigration status or have not complied with the immigration rules will not be allowed to register and may have their visa sponsorship revoked.

EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS)

EU, EEA & Swiss nationals with settled or pre-settled status under the EUSS must prove their immigration status at their registration event. They must do this using the digital immigration checking service at gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status

Student Visa (The Student Route)

The Student Route is open to all non-UK nationals and EU, EEA, and Swiss nationals who do not have settled or pre-settled status under the EUSS.

The route requires that applicants have a genuine offer to study on an approved course, at an accredited institution, with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS). It also requires applicants to demonstrate that they have sufficient funds to support themselves during study, and have the required knowledge of English.

MetFilm School conducts a series of checks to ensure applicants are genuine and satisfy all entry requirements prior to issuing a CAS.

The UK Council for International Student Affairs (UKCISA) has an excellent website with plenty of information on how to apply, and guidance on life as an international student living in the UK. For more information visit ukcisa.org.uk.

Most Student Visa applicants must apply from outside of the UK. The earliest you can enter the UK is one month before your course start date. You will be advised of your Student Visa start date in your Home Office decision letter. It is vital that you do not come to the UK before your start date, as you may invalidate your visa.

Students entering the UK prior to their Student Visa start date will be required to leave the UK and re-enter on the relevant date.

Working on a Visa

Students are allowed to work up to 20 hours per week during term time. This is a maximum of 20 hours in total in any one week, including paid or unpaid work, and for one or more organisations. Student Visas do not allow students to be self-employed. There are no limits on the amount of hours that can be worked during MetFilm School scheduled vacation periods.

After your Studies

The Graduate Route is a post-study work visa which provides an opportunity for international students who have successfully achieved their degree qualification to stay in the UK and work, or look for work, at any skill level, for two years.

This is an unsponsored route, meaning you do not need a job offer to apply. You can work flexibly, switch jobs, and develop your career in the UK as required. This visa cannot be used for pursuing further study.



Getting to MetFilm School London

Travelling to London from an Airport via Car & London Transport

London Heathrow to MetFilm School London



22 minutes via car (6.9 miles)

Alternatively, you can get the Piccadilly Line on the London Underground directly through to South Ealing Station (33 minutes).

London City Airport to MetFilm School London



1hr via car (28.2 miles)

Alternatively, you can get the Docklands Light Railway (DLR) into Central London and connect to other various Underground stations to reach MetFilm School.

London Stansted Airport to MetFilm School London



1hr 5 minutes via car (43.8 miles)

Alternatively, you can take the Stansted Express to London's Liverpool Street Station (45 minutes), where you can then take the Central Line Underground train to Ealing Broadway.

London Gatwick Airport to MetFilm School London



58 minutes via car (49.6 miles)

Alternatively, you can take the Gatwick Express, a direct to London Victoria, where you can catch a District Line train to Ealing Broadway.



London Transport

Transport for London (TfL) and their website tfl.gov.uk will provide you with a basic guide to everything you need to know about getting around the city. You can use the Journey Planner, find out when your bus is due, download maps and keep track of station and trainline closures.

The Underground does not run all night; however, some routes do run a night service. Check before you travel!

Top Free London Transport Apps

1. **Citymapper** – Simply add your start and end location and Citymapper will advise you on all the different transport options available to you i.e. buses, underground routes, walking, and cycling. (Available on iOS and Android)
2. **Kabbee** – Kabbee compares the price of 70 different minicab companies in London. You can pay for the journey by credit card via the app. (Available on iOS and Android)
3. **Busmapper** – If you are a regular user of London buses then the Busmapper app will assist you with live departures and route planning. (Available on iOS)

Oyster Cards

London's entire transport system (with the exception of taxis) accepts Oyster Cards for payment. You won't be able to use cash to buy tickets. If you have a contactless credit or debit card, this works exactly the same and costs no more than an oyster card.

Where to purchase an Oyster card?

You will need to pay £5 for an Oyster card.

- At Oyster Ticket Stops in many newsagents in London tfl.gov.uk/maps/oyster-ticket-stops
- At all tube, overground, and most TfL Rail Stations

Topping up your Oyster card

- Online with a contactless and Oyster account, if you live in the UK
- Using the free TfL Oyster and Contactless app
- At Oyster Ticket Stops in many newsagents in London
- At all tube, overground, and most TfL Rail Stations

18+ Student Oyster Photocard

If you are 18 or over, a student, and living in a London borough, you can get discounted travel with an Oyster photocard, where you can save 30% on adult-rate travelcards.

Getting to MetFilm School Leeds

Travelling to Leeds from an Airport via Car & Leeds Transport

Leeds Bradford Airport to MetFilm School Leeds



20 minutes via car (7.0 miles)

Alternatively, you can travel via coach, taking the A1 Flyer from Leeds Bradford Airport to Washington Street Stop, a 3min walk from MetFilm School Leeds.

Manchester Airport to MetFilm School Leeds



1hr 5 minutes via car (59.0 miles)

Alternatively, you can travel into Leeds via the Transpennine Express (1hr 30mins), and walk (20 mins) to MetFilm School Leeds.

Liverpool Airport to MetFilm School Leeds



1hr 20 minutes via car (71.6 miles)

Alternatiely, you can take the 500 bus to St Johns Market (35 mins), switch to the Transpennine Express to Leeds (1hr 45 mins), and walk (15 mins) to MetFilm School Leeds.

London to MetFilm School Leeds



3hr 20 minutes via car (197 miles)

Alternatively, you can take the train from London Kings Cross Station to Leeds (2h 15 minutes), and walk (10 mins) to MetFilm School Leeds.



Leeds Transport

West Yorkshire Metro

You can travel to and around Leeds city centre via bus and train. You can use the WY Metro Journey Planner to find out when your bus is due, download maps, and keep track of station and trainline closures.

Most buses and trains run from 5am-11pm; however some routes do run a night service, including the N1 bus. Make sure to check before you travel!

Top Free Leeds Transport Apps

- 1. First Bus App** – Plan your journey, check live bus times, and buy tickets for buses, including tickets for Heathrow RailAir and Bright Bus Tours. (Available on iOS and Android)
- 2. Moovit**– Moovit is a personal journey assistant which provides real-time arrivals and updates, digital payment, live directions, and includes bike routes around Leeds. (Available on iOS and Android)
- 3. UK Bus Tracker** – Provides real-time bus information and the ability to purchase mobile tickets for journeys across Great Britain, with additional information for tram, ferry, and underground journeys. (Available on iOS and Android)

Metro Cards

You can travel throughout West Yorkshire with a 19-25 or Student Photocard. You can pre-load this card for discounted travel on the bus and train.

Where to purchase a 19-25 or Student Card?

If you are aged 19-25, you can purchase this card either online, or at a Travel Centre. If you are a Mature Student, you will need to bring proof that you are in full-time education.

Railcards

If you are planning on travelling around the UK during your time at MetFilm School, you might consider purchasing a railcard, which takes 1/3 off the price of all train tickets you purchase, and can be stored digitally on your phone.

Where to purchase a railcard?

Depending on your age and requirements, there are multiple railcard options available, including 16-25 years, 26-30 years, and 'Two Together'. You can purchase your railcard by visiting the website railcard.co.uk

Packing

What to pack in your hand luggage?

Make sure you pack the following important items in your hand luggage and keep them with you at all times

- Your passport
- Your Confirmation of Acceptance to Study (CAS)
- Your Visa decision letter from the Home Office
- Any medication you are taking
- Details and policy wording for your insurance
- Enough money for your first few weeks
- Any accommodation contracts or payments that you have been asked to bring with you
- TB Certificate

Packing Appropriate Clothing

British weather changes throughout the year. During Summer (June to August) temperatures can reach 25-30 degrees. Whilst in the Winter they often drop to around 5 degrees during the day, and there is usually some snowfall in December, January or February.
